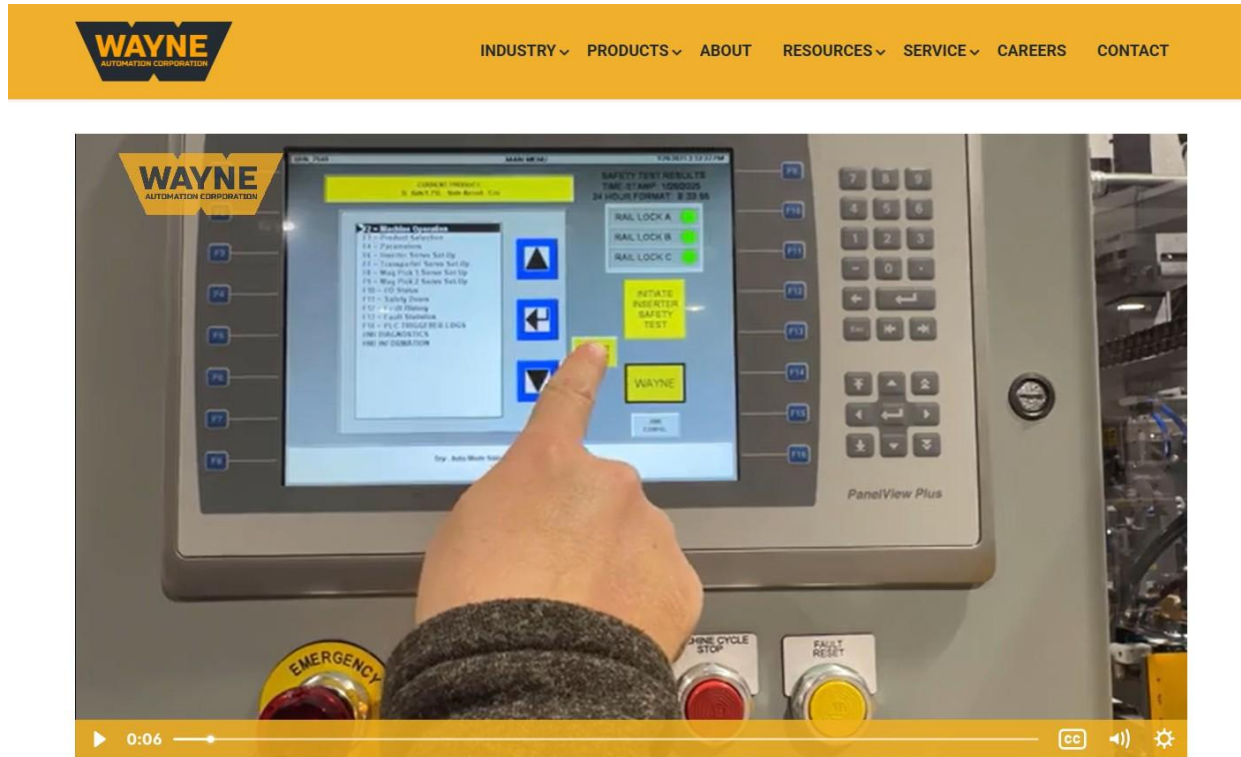

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[Step 1: Starting the Setup] Voice-over: "To start the KeyGuard Control® setup, our operator taps the 'KEYFOB SCREEN' option on the touchscreen. He then registers a new keyfob, generating a unique ID linked to each user."	0:00–0:14
[Step 2: Assigning User Roles] Voice-over: "Next, he uses the control's keypad to input an identifying name, which could be an individual's name or more generically their role. Then the key fob is assigned an access level, which will control what can be accessed and changed on the equipment.	0:15–0:32
[Step 3: Blocking Unauthorized Controls] Voice-over: "The operator disengages the 'EMERGENCY STOP,' then presses and holds the 'MASTER CONTROL RESET' button. Taking this action is necessary to reset and run the equipment. However, the system prevents him from moving forward, displaying a lockout message until he presents a valid keyfob. At this point, he re-scans his operator-level keyfob, which permits him to initiate a cycle start and begin operation of the machine.	0:33–1:00

[Step 4: Testing Access Level] Voice-over: A team member may view the equipment parameters, but is not permitted to change them without having a KeyGuard Control badge. The operator scans his key fob on the left side of the KeyGuard Control, but the system denies him the ability to change parameters—his key fob doesn't have the necessary permissions. Each keyfob has a built-in RFID chip that only allows settings changes when the user has the correct access level. Now, a maintenance team member steps in and scans their key fob. They have the required access level to make changes to parameters. After confirming the change, logging out is as simple as one touch on the HMI.	1:01–1:41
[Step 5: Final Event Log Check] Voice-over: “Accessed from the HMI or function keys, the event log displays the sequence of machine faults, warnings, and user changes.	1:41–1:51
[Step 6: Returning to Vacuum Controls] Voice-over: “ The event log shows a chronological list of color-coded events. Touching any single event shows details, including who was logged in for the event,	1:52–2:10

and in the case of parameter changes, the before and after settings. A quick access button allows for direct navigation to that parameter to make a change.”	
[Step 7: Final Confirmation and Wrap-Up] Voice-over: “To complete the process, the maintenance team member double-checks the newly adjusted settings and confirms that access levels are correct. With everything in order, the machine is ready for operation.”	2:10–2:17
